Description

Pte Percival Eric GRATWICK (1902-1942) VC recipient was a 38-year-old former gold prospector from Western Australia. He enlisted on 20th December 1940 and became a member of the 2/48th Battalion. On the night of 25-26th October 1942, in an attack at Miteiriya Ridge, Gratwick's company suffered heavy casualties and was held up by intense enemy fire; his platoon lost its commander, its Sergeant, and most of the men. Seeing the seriousness of the situation, Gratwick launched a single-handed attack with grenades, rifle, and bayonet on the German posts. He finally fell to a burst of machine-gun fire. His lone efforts had a big impact, inspiring all those around him and enabling the company to advance.

Gratwick is buried at EL ALAMEIN WAR CEMETERY GRAVE XXII. A. 6.
